It guarantees a necessary balance



It guarantees that you preach hard texts



You will model proper Bible study methods to your congregation



It will promote long pastorates

It demonstrates to your congregation both the authority and sufficiency of the Scripture



It will deepen your own understanding of the Bible and your own devotional time



It will enrich your topical sermons
